HUNGRY BULLETIN

The Community Food Pantry in Tampa, FL does much more than provide food to the hungry. Their mission is to "end the physical and emotional hunger of families in a dignified manner." In addition to giving out food to those in need, they also offer free health screenings, education on nutrition, and assistance to veterans.

This food pantry was started in 2008. Some of the members of Village Presbyterian Church in Tampa began stocking a closet with canned and boxed food items for those who asked for help with groceries. The number of people in need started to increase, and in 2009, the members converted half of the church office building into the Community Food Pantry. It has become more and more successful over the last seven years. In 2012, they started a program called "Youth Take Over the Pantry." This is a summer program in which high school students volunteered at the pantry doing cleaning and handing out food. The food pantry also started a successful holiday program in 2013 called "Everything But the Turkey." In 2015, the pantry began participating in "Give Day Tampa Bay," "Giving Tuesday," and "Kindness Day." Participation in these events helped raise money and bring in food donations.

The Community Food Pantry helped feed 20,000 people in 2016, 8% of which are seniors and 38% of which are children. On February 3, the pantry is participating in what is known as "Shred Day." Those who donate canned goods that day will get their "sensitive documents shredded for free." What a great idea with tax season coming up!



FROM THE PASTOR

THE CALL TO FAITHFULNESS

When we lived in Knoxville, Tennessee, Tom and I would often go with the kids after church to Calhoun's, a restaurant on the Tennessee riverfront. It was a family-friendly restaurant that boasted the best ribs in the state. As was our custom, Tom and I would critique the sermon over lunch. His observation would be that the senior pastor would once again have preached a sermon whose response hymn could be "Great Is Thy Faithfulness." The faithfulness of God was the pastor's favorite topic, and for good reason. An accomplished horseman, he had had an accident on a horse where he fell and hit his head causing his brain to swell. He nearly lost his life in this incident, which happened about 18 months before Tom and I arrived in Knoxville. After months in the hospital, the pastor recovered, thanks to the faithfulness of God to see him through. He never forgot.

While it might not be a good idea to preach on God's faithfulness every week, it certainly does not hurt to reflect upon it now and again. In response to God's faithfulness we are called to respond with our own faithfulness. I note some true faithfulness here at Westminster this year. In practical terms, I see the faithfulness of our congregation in giving generously to the church — our giving from members is up this year. Well done. We are still dipping deeply into our endowment fund, which is a concern, but if this congregation remains faithful to its mission, I believe we can survive and thrive where we have been planted.

The newly elected and ordained officers have been faithful to God's call to serve, and we have a superb group. I am excited to work with our newly ordained officers as well as those returning and once again offering their service expressing their love of Christ and his church. Each of our officers works hard and has a given task to perform as well as attending meetings of their respective boards.

We have tried to be faithful in worship — offering our best to God each week. The choir and bells have graced our services faithfully, bringing inspiration and joy each week. Those who serve on Sundays come faithfully to do the tasks that make for a seamless service — from preparing communion to being ushers, to greeting folks as they enter church, to working the sound board — we have faithful saints.

In providing a second worship service each week in the Jazz Vespers, we have sought to be faithful in bringing our best before God. The service is more simple and geared toward visitors, but the quality of what we do remains faithful to our Book of Order and the tradition of worship done 'decently and in order,' even if it does swing! David Hoffman has been a faithful leader in the music of this service, bringing us world-class jazz each week and even writing new music for each service. This has been a joy!

As your pastor, I work toward being faithful in my responsibilities to lead worship, preach and administer the sacraments, as well as being the head of staff, chief visitor and so many other tasks I pick up along the way.

My mentor, the late Rev. Dr. Richard Adams reminded me, and his congregation, regularly, "We are not called to be successful, we are called to be faithful. If we are faithful – God will do the rest." I believe this to be true with all my heart and soul. As we faithfully answer God's call on our lives – God will be there to do God's part.


SESSION NOTES

From the January 10 Session Meeting

- ♦ Received a thank you letter from the Center for the Prevention of Abuse for mission gift of \$900.
- ♦ Brian Hakes was elected for a one-year term as Clerk of Session.
- ♦ Dick Helfrich and Brian Hakes were elected for a one-year term as treasurers.
- Gary Leonard, Dick Helfrich and Brian Hakes were authorized to sign checks for the next year.
- ♦ The session voted to remove Gary Paneta and Charles Byrkit from the Rolls.
- ♦ The food pantry served 1,202 people in December, a total of 19,444 people in 2016.
- ♦ Caterpillar provided boxes of food to the WestMark Food Pantry on December 22.
- ♦ WestMark Food Pantry received a large food donation from United Presbyterian Church.
- ♦ \$250 from the Vanderau Fund was a mission gift to the Heart of Illinois Special Recreation.
- ♦ Cases of surplus raisins from the food pantry were donated to Roosevelt School.
- As per the city zoning laws, the Parish House is zoned as R1. A special use permit may be required should the building be used for other purposes.
- Ruyle installed a new wiring harness on the humidifier in the sanctuary and changed the setting to be turned on when the humidity level hits 30%.
- ♦ S. F. Pauli Builders submitted a bid of \$23,525 to construct a bathroom in the storage room off the Fellowship Hall of the main floor of the William O'Neill Parish House.
