Just log on Westminster's website at <a href="http://westminsterpeoria.org/support">http://westminsterpeoria.org/support</a> and click the "donate" button on the main screen. The donate button is on the bottom at the right. Just give it time to come up.

You will find seven choices. The choices are: the General Fund, the Iben Sponsorships, Westmark Food Pantry, Westminster Infant Care Center, Jazz Vesper Service, Current Year Pledges and Fellowship Hall Restoration Fund. You can use a direct withdrawal from your savings or checking account or you can use a credit card. In the "TO" box, click on the down arrow to find your selection.

The session is hoping to give Fellowship Hall a much needed face lift with new carpeting, new blinds and fresh paint on the walls. The estimated cost is \$15,000. Donations would be much appreciated.

## THE HUNGRY BULLETIN

Heart of Illinois Harvest is a non-profit organization that transports food from grocery stores and restaurants in the Peoria area to local churches and shelters that give it out to those in need. The organization first began in 1992. In 1994 and 1996, Harvest won first place in the Governor's Hometown Awards.

It was recognized as a volunteer organization that helps contribute to Illinois' "economic progress and quality of life. " Harvest is "powered by volunteers." There are around fifty volunteers altogether. Harvest uses what they are given from grants and donations to run their food truck, which runs six days a week, usually for



about four hours. It takes approximately twenty dollars to run the truck each day.



Harvest collects between six and seven tons of food each week. The food that they are given consists mainly of bread, baked goods, canned foods, and produce. Some of the grocery stores that donate food to Harvest are

Kroger, HyVee, Shop N Save, and Schnucks. A few of the local restaurants include Panera, Einstein Brothers, La Gondola, and Pizza Hut. Waugh Foods in East Peoria donates items as well. The food that is picked up is taken a number of different places, including Southside Mission, Sophia's Kitchen, Ward Chapel, Hurlburt House, Friendship House, and Benevolence. Some of these places use the food to prepare meals for the needy. Others give out food by the sacksful. Harvest is an extremely successful organization that helps those in need on a daily basis. •

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL LUNCHEON AND MEETING.





- Approved the letter of transfer for Bill Thomas to Crossroad Christian Church.
- Approved the letter of transfer for John and Gayle Porter to First Federated Presbyterian.
- Received a thank you for mission support from: The Boys and Girls Clubs, Kemmerer Village and Common Place.
- Rev. Bill Carter Jazz CD's containing jazz music and conversation of integrating the music into worship is for sale at a price of \$5 per CD.
- The food pantry received a generous financial gift through the website from a donor in Boston, Massachusetts.
- The revenue projection for the 2016 budget is \$582,683 with \$415,388 coming from the development fund.
- The food pantry served 2,207 people in November.
- Instead of the expected 10 children from WICC there are only 3 enrolled. These three children and others from Common Place will be recipients of the Christmas Tree Fund.
- WICC is considering expanding its boundary north to include students from Richwood High School.
- WICC is considering accepting babies from private payers.
- Oliver Woodman has accepted an invitation and will join the personnel committee.
- Personnel committee and Mary Lee Caudle will pursue hiring a temporary employee after the first of the year.
- Ruhl will replace the sanctuary AC unit in the spring.
- Cambridge Home Improvement will replace the flat roof and skylight in the spring.
- Meister will install a water line and faucet in green space behind the parish house.
- The properties committee is working on recommendations from the church insurance company regarding loss control opportunities.
- Work was completed on the sanctuary boilers. This included replacing a leaking expansion joint, a pump and valve at a cost of \$2,460.
- A kitchen dishwasher was repaired at a cost of \$217.
- The worship committee is working on a task list for the worship service.


