Celebrating OUR GRADUATES





Pastor Denise Clark-Jones reported that plans for the 2019 Summer Music Camp are under development.

After investigation, the Properties Committee has determined that the small raised planting area near the front door of the Parish Hall should be removed. The brickwork on the planter has deteriorated to the point where any attempt at repair or replacement will probably just result in an ongoing maintenance problem. What will replace the planter has yet to be determined.

The Properties Committee is also looking into ways to rehabilitate the pillars in front of the Malvern Lane entrance to the church. It is obvious that this area needs attention.

The Session has been discussing ways of raising the profile of the church through advertising. Bill-boards, newspaper advertisements, and social media postings are among the methods that have been used recently. The effectiveness of these efforts is unknown at this time, but it is clear that the "Westminster Message" needs to be more visible.

Nine hundred ten people were served by the food pantry during the past month. ❖

REMEMBERING BOTH CROSS AND RESURRECTION

As I am writing this, it is the start of Holy Week. Yesterday we celebrated a memorable Palm Sunday – 5 inches of snow! In mid-April! It is hard to think about May and post-Easter Sunday when your spiritual journey is taking you to the cross. And so it is for us. We already know the end of the story, we celebrate it every Sunday; yet, during difficult times the joy of resurrection, which is fueled for us by hope, loses its power when faced with the harsh realities of the world - most particularly imminent death. This week family friends are waiting for the end of the life of a brave, bright and beautiful daughter, sister, wife, mother and grandmother - her first grandchild is to be baptized on Easter. Her cancer is doing its worst to her physical body at the end. I am reminded of my mother, who died shortly after Easter more than 20 years ago, and the many hospital and hospice rooms I have visited with the whole family crowded around their loved one, waiting for the inevitable end. When resurrection is the final and only hope, it is hard to feel joy.

This is why we pray our second prayer in the communion liturgy. The first prayer is for praise and thanksgiving to God. The second prayer is called "The Anamnesis" from the Greek word meaning "reminiscence" or "memorial sacrifice." This Greek word was used in Luke's gospel (22:19) when Jesus instructed his disciples to continue the practice of breaking bread and sharing a common cup with the words: "Do this in 'remembrance' of me." We sing after the prayer

these words: "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." We remember his painful death, we rejoice in the Resurrection, and affirm our hope that Christ will come again, ushering in the full kingdom of God on earth. After Easter we do not forget Good Friday, which seemed to have nothing "good" about it. But we remember, with the knowledge of the whole story.

When we use the word "remembrance," we are referring, as Jesus did, to the whole story of Jesus - why he came, what he did on earth, and what his Resurrection and continued presence means for us. The Passover meal, which Jesus and his disciples shared the night before his arrest and crucifixion, remembered not just the night of the first Passover meal, but the whole story of God's presence in the life of the people Israel. In the same way, Jesus asked his disciples to remember the whole story of his presence on earth for the sake of reconciliation with God and neighbor. Jesus lived God's commandment to love God and neighbor in a way people could see, imitate, and allow God's revelation in Christ to transform their lives.

During the weeks of the Easter season, we will continue to follow Christ's command to share the communal meal he sanctified while we hear and study the book of "The Acts of the Apostles," which continues Christ's story with the birth of the Church. There were more crosses in the story, more persecutions, more injustices committed by the empire; but, remembering what Christ had done and instructed them to do, the apostles and the new disciples knew the whole story and were given the power of the Holy Spirit to face all challenges, even death. Alleluia!
