Greetings from River City Music Therapy (RCMT)! RCMT is a private music therapy practice serving the Greater Peoria Area, and we're your new tenants at 1504 W. Moss. Since 2013, Katie Fitch, owner, has been providing services to clients across the lifespan in their homes, in the schools, and within contracting agencies. Our largest clientele right now is school-aged children. We specialize in the social emotional domains, assessing and intervening to support classroom success. We're setting up shop in Westminster's Parish House, because it's time to bring our clients to us! We've just brought on a new provider, Allison Stratman, MT-BC, and we're setting up to provide programming in the clinic! We're using the Morgan Room to organize our caseloads and collaborate, facilitate group sessions and music lessons, and host informational and advocational events!

You're probably wondering what music therapy is. After over a decade of studying and practicing, I can tell you that's a hard question to answer given the diversity of therapists and clients practicing. To boil it down, music therapists use the medium of music to address and make progress on nonmusical, functional goals. That means we engage in music with our clients, but our focus is on the nonmusical, functional skill around which we've designed the intervention. Music therapists work in a wide variety of settings: schools, hospitals, older adult facilities, memory care, maternity, wellness, the list goes on and on. LENTEN BIBLE STUDY

A Lenten study to begin in February.

The last Sunday of the Epiphany season ends with a grand, light-filled revelation, the Transfiguration of Christ. On the following Wednesday, February 26, we begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. We usually think of Lent as a time of personal introspection and spiritual practices, but the time was originally devoted to a corporate reminder of baptismal vows. In the infancy of Christianity, during the weeks before Easter, the "congregation" engaged in a time of study, fasting and prayer with those preparing for Baptism on Easter Sunday. Coming together with others who are trying to walk the path Jesus has shown us has amazing power. Jesus assured his disciples that he would be with them, even after he left this mortal soil: "...where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." (Matthew 18:20)

During Lent we are invited "to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor" by exercising the Disciplines of Lent: repentance, fasting, prayer and almsgiving. Living out a discipline takes our Lord's words about obedience and self-denial seriously. Jesus told his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. (Matthew 16:24).

Another word for "almsgiving" is "works of love." Of all the Lenten disciplines, "Works of Love" is the spiritual practice on which we put the most emphasis in the Protestant tradition. Our Lord Jesus Christ instructed his disciples: 'love one another as I have loved you' (John 15:12) and 'whatever you do for the least of these, my brothers and sisters, you do for me" (Matthew 25:40).

Lent is known as a time of personal sacrifice. The oftendebated question is: "Is it better to give up something or take up something for Lent? My interpretation of the bible is that any sacrifice that does not give to someone else is little service to God's kingdom. Does giving up foods that you fear are making you overweight serve the kingdom of God? Perhaps, if your motivation is honoring and preserving the gift of life and a healthy body God has given you. But, is this not only half of the sacrifice? When we have more than we need on our tables, Jesus reminds us that we have a responsibility to help those whose tables have not enough food. The great preacher of the Riverside Church in New York City, William Sloan Coffin said: "The banality of guilt is that it is such a convenient substitute for responsibility. It's so much easier

to beat your breast than to stick your neck out." At the last session of the Paul Study this fall, attendants asked about future adult studies and suggested we do one around the theme of Lent. I will be leading a three-part seminar: "Why We Do What We Do during Lent," beginning Sunday, February 23, and continuing for the following two Sundays. We will meet in the Chapel after the morning worship service. A light lunch will be provided.

In the course of the study we will look at the

growth and practices of the early church; the scriptural basis for the season; the varying practices through the history of Christianity; and the ways in which we can keep a "holy" Lent this year. Part history and part spiritual formation, this Lenten study invites you to make this Lent one that informs and nurtures your faith.

I encourage you to engage Lent this year. Make coming to church your first priority during this


