

March 28, 2021 | 10:00 AM







Please register for each worship service that you plan on attending.

We are excited to be able to welcome in-person worshippers in a safe and sacredly-distanced capacity beginning Sunday, March 28, which is also Palm Sunday.

The CDC says once vaccinated, a person cannot pass the disease to another. So we are returning to worship in the Sanctuary on Palm Sunday, <u>pre-registrations required</u>, while still being very careful.
