

Realm is a real ministry tool.

Realm is an online ministry tool designed for real time connection. It helps our church connect with you and you connect with us. If you consider yourself part of this church family, you'll love it. Realm allows you to manage your personal information and who is allowed to see it, control your giving, and keep in touch with the groups that matter to you. Realm's **Connect App** is the way to access and manage all your information and connect with the groups you are involved in as part of our church family.

WHY USE REALM? Realm strengthens church connections.

Being the church doesn't just happen at the church. Realm helps us serve you better and leads this church well between Sundays. Everyone can be connected from anywhere at any time, right from our mobile devices using the **Connect App**. It engages everyone in the life of our church by supporting the healthy relationships essential to our church's mission. We'll stay organized, and you'll stay informed about all of the opportunities for fellowship. When we share life together, we will grow together.

WHAT ABOUT MY PRIVACY? Realm is safe, private, and secure.

Your privacy is one of our greatest concerns. Realm is only made up of the people in our church; it's not like a social network that's open to everyone. Realm keeps your data safe and gives you control over what information you share and who can see it.

WHAT ABOUT GIVING? Realm gives you control over your giving.

Giving should be easy, and Realm places giving right in the palm of your hands. Using **Realm** online via our church website or the **Connect App**, you can set up recurring gifts, view your giving history, and make changes at any time. Realm automatically records all electronic gifts and adds them to your giving record making it easy for you to give, and easy for our bookkeeper to track.

HOW DO I START?

It's quick and easy to get started:

- Go to https://onrealm.org/Westminster1420
- Click the "Sign Up" Button
- Fill out the form
- Click "Continue" Button at bottom
- A Confirmation Email will be sent back within 24 hours
- Follow the emailed instructions to set up your username and password
- Download the app from your phone app store (android or apple)



has fond memories of growing up with his 5 siblings. He was the first born and his parents had 4 boys in 8 years. His parents also adopted two others-one girl and one boy. His mom cared for "so many foster kids and they were treated the same as the rest". His maternal grandfather was the only grandparent he knew as the others had already passed away before his birth. He cherished this man and was drawn to him due to his "love and compassion for his grandchildren". He enjoyed picking berries and working in the garden with him.

His parents were "very active" in the church where he was raised from the time he was 5 or 6. His father was a leader/church elder and his mom taught Sunday School "for years". Tim described his parents as "very Godly folks". They were involved in church activities Sunday morning, Sunday night, and Wednesdays after school. He credits growing up in this church as the reason he was drawn to the ministry.

Tim met his wife, Kathy, at the Clinical Pastoral Education Program held in Bloomington. They have a blended family of her two sons and his two daughters, who are all about the same age. His daughters are both nurses. One works at OSF in Peoria in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and the other one is a Nurse Practitioner in an ICU in California.

Tim enjoys woodworking and his "masterpiece" was the hardwood floors he installed in the living room, dining room, and hallway of his home. He also enjoys home remodeling, and his most challenging project was replacing siding and windows on his house.

His favorite food is lobster, and his favorite dessert is "anything apple", such as apple pie. He has many favorite books, but a recent favorite is Molokai,

a book about a leper colony in Hawaii. His favorite vacation spot is "any beach", but one outstanding one is Molokai in Hawaii.
